

PRAYER IN OUR PARISH


In this parish we believe wholeheartedly in the power of prayer and are always happy to intercede for others: God's answers to our prayers are an encouragement to us all.

JULIAN MEETINGS

Julian Meetings are groups of people who meet regularly in order to grow in the practice of contemplative prayer in the Christian tradition. There are many groups around the country and also a few worldwide.

Groups are ecumenical and no previous experience is required. Contemplative prayer is a way of prayer in which the individual seeks to be aware of the presence of God and to remain silently, attentively in that presence: to be completely open to God.

Meetings are held once a month on a Monday afternoon. Plenty of explanation is given before the time of prayer, and tea and coffee are served afterwards.
