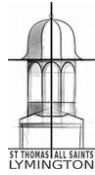

Sadly, we have had temporarily to withdraw our applications for Planning Permission and Listed Building Consent in connection with this project. We have been asked to provide a large amount of detail on certain aspects of our proposals and this will take time to work up. Having discussed the way ahead with the NFDC Planning Officer, it became apparent that she was unable to grant us a long enough extension in which to get this additional work done and so we have withdrawn the applications. Our intention is to resubmit them, with the additional information requested, as soon as possible.
