### **Opening St.Thomas for private prayer:**

On Thursday our church was opened at last. All the West doors are open wide to facilitate both fresh air circulation and easy passage for visiting pray-ers to enter and exit. Clear floor marking and signage aims to keep everyone safe. Please use sanitizer on entry and exit. In line with government guidelines, the necessary cleaning will occur daily.

NB The toilet facilities and the servery are excluded; drinking water is available from the tap outside the West door. Opening times are 10am to 4pm every day. (This might be extended on some days for the convenience of those who lock/unlock).

### **The Leprosy Mission:**

The Leprosy Mission have asked for our help and support. They are concerned that the Government has announced plans to scrap DFID UK funding. This decision could be disastrous for The Leprosy Mission, threatening vital funding that continues to help some of the world's poorest people.

We need to act together to protect the Aid budget. They are asking us to send a message to our local MP (or if you are on Twitter #SaveAid), to let the government know that aid spending should remain focused on ending poverty and helping vulnerable people. This funding provides life-changing work, but this latest parliamentary decision puts all of this at a huge risk.

Please let us advocate for the millions worldwide whose lives still need to be transformed by UK Aid. Please act now and #SaveAid so the no one is left behind. Your support will be very much appreciated by The Leprosy Mission.
