



Week 4. Fair Trade

- In a nutshell, describe what you think is fair trade?
- Read Psalm 22:23-31
- How does God look upon the poor & 'the afflicted' (those in [persistent] distress)?

This Psalm is one of Lament, whereby the Psalmist, in confronting the misery of the poor & afflicted is able to appreciate the bigger picture of God's care and provision & come to a place of praise rather than despair.

- How do you feel about seeing / hearing news of persistent poverty and deprivation?
- What does the Bible teach us about who is our neighbour and how he should be treated? (See Luke 10:25-37, Leviticus 19:13 & 25:14)
- What are our responsibilities towards those in need?
- Do you consider yourself to be rich?
- Have you ever felt guilty about buying or consuming something because you are aware of an injustice in the supply or production of the product?
- Injustice is a major theme throughout the Bible. How might Fair Trade principles make a difference in shaping our generosity towards people living in desperate circumstances?
- Do you regularly try and buy products that are ethically sourced or fairly traded?
- What else might we bear in mind when we are shopping and thinking about where our goods come from?
- Close in pray, remembering the over 800,000 farmers and their families that benefit from being in Fair trade Co-operatives around the world.

Paths to Spiritual Growth

Fair Trade is an alternative approach to international trade that is built on a network of right relationships that respect human dignity, promote economic justice and cultivate global solidarity.

Principles :

- * Producers receive a fair wage (living wage)
- * Producers have access to financial & technical assistance
- * Sustainability is encouraged
- * Working conditions are safe & healthy
- * Equal employment opportunities are provided for all
- * All aspects of trade & production are open to public accountability.
