DOXECOLOGY 3: The Hope of Creation


For God's people, the book of Leviticus was the place to find values and rules for daily living. What do you know about Sabbath and Jubilee?

Read Leviticus 25:1-12

- Why do you think we have no record of the Year of Jubilee ever being practised?
 Can you imagine any such practice today?
- If the way you use your resources is a vote for the kind of world you want to live in, what are you voting for?
- What personal practices of Sabbath or Jubilee might you adopt?
- How much is your life characterised by gratitude to God? Is there anything you could do to live more gratefully?

Read 2 Peter 3:11-13 and Revelation 21:1-2, 22:1-5

- For the word 'new', Peter uses the Greek word kainos, meaning 'renewed' rather than the word neo, meaning something that has not existed before. Also see Revelation 21:1 What does this imply?
- When you picture eternity with God, what does it look like? Does your picture match Revelation 21 and 22?
- What difference might it make to your everyday life to think that God will renew all creation?
- 'Take our efforts and our passions' how might you cooperate with God as you engage in your skills, work and hobbies?
- How can we as Christians maintain and promote hope, despite the state of the planet?
