Background

Amos was a native of Tekoa (12 miles south of Jerusalem), a shepherd (hence the motif) and a dresser of fig trees. The call of God to the prophetic ministry came to him whilst tending the flock. Amos prophesied in the northern kingdom during part of the reign of Jeroboam 2nd (785 – 744 B.C.), King of Israel, and during the reign of Uzziah (780 – 740 B.C.), King of Judah.
