Energy use: A survey of the Church and Hall, which was carried out in 2022/3, resulted in some cost savings. Can the Can! Both tin and aluminium can be recycled. If all cans in the UK were recycled, we would need 14 million fewer dustbins. Recycling an aluminium can takes 1/4 of the energy to make a can than it does from the ore, and 1 recycled tin can would save enough energy to power a television for 3 hours. Aluminium cans can be recycled and ready to use in just 6 weeks. Clean aluminium can be put in the container in the Narthex.
